From the Pastor's desk... Dear Church Family,



Spring is almost here. It is the time of renewed life. With the songbirds, the sound of Spring returns after long winter of silence. The first shoots of daffodils, skunk cabbage, and pitcher plants emerge from the hard ground. Everything brown sheds its winter coat and bursts forth in living color.

We glory in Christ alone, and we enjoy his presence forever. Amen. In His Grace, Pastor Justin Choi





April 18: A Net Full of Fish-what's that all about? John 21:1-17 Luke5 1-11.


April 25: Where did Jesus Go? Acts 1:6-12.

### Women's Association News

### Some interesting history—

In September 1928 a Cemetery Care Committee was formed by the Ladies Aid Society for the specific purpose of caring for the cemetery grounds.

In May 1932, in a booklet to celebrate the 125th anniversary celebration of the church, it is noted on page 13,

"An outstanding achievement of the Ladies Aid Society was accomplished in clearing up the cemetery and grounds immediately surrounding the Church. For many years, the property surrounding the Church had been neglected and was in deplorable condition; monuments had fallen, weeds, brush, and briars, had reclaimed this old historic burying ground, and it was no longer a pleasing background for a House of Worship. Through their efforts, the grounds were made beautiful, lending dignity to our old Church. After two years of working raising funds for the carrying thru of this project, the society was able not only to have the work completed, but to report that \$1000.00 was invested as a trust fund, for the perpetual care of the cemetery."

In December of 1944 the \$1000.00 was invested in a War Bond. In later years the money was used for various projects relating to the overall care of the grounds around the church. The money being sent to the church treasurer.

We no longer have a Cemetery Care Committee but we do have our wonderful Senior Saints and some other volunteers who work to keep our church looking beautiful.

Present day 2021, we have been busy with our Cookie Walk and Fish and Chips dinner even in the midst of a pandemic.

Our Fish and Chips dinner ran very smoothly thanks to chairperson, Carol Stanhope and Mary Macheska our Coleslaw queen. Shoprite was kind enough to donate all the coleslaw ingredients, the lemons, the rolls, containers and plastic bags. Thanks to all the volunteers and all the others who wanted to help but were turned away due to Covid restrictions. We sold 260 dinners and along with the sale of Diane's gnomes our profit was \$2192.00.

We have our outdoor craft fair coming on May 22nd.

We have received approval from the Session and the town to go ahead with "Aunt Jenny's Attic" and we're excited about that.

We urge all of you to come out and join us, it's good for your mental health. Our next meeting is March 25th at 10 AM in fellowship hall. We will be discussing having our meetings after church in the future.


