Jason Ko who provided insight on some of his work with his congregation in La Mirada, California. He has been successful increasing church attendance and membership within a congregation that was continuously dwindling in numbers. He shared some reading material that would be helpful for leadership to consider examining along with conversations that took place within his church that helped spur change. I jotted down some quotes from his presentation that may help us in our quest to build up our own church:


