Our November Session meeting was the last opportunity for Elders to meet with Pastor Choi as our moderator. There was much to be accomplished and Pastor Choi was very helpful in assisting us in making plans for the month ahead. Our congregation will see a revolving schedule of Pastors or Commissioned Elders officiating Sunday worship throughout November and December. We hope to make these people feel welcome during their time with us. We plan on only one service for Christmas Eve. Details and times for that service remain a work in progress. Christmas Day is a Sunday with expected small attendance, therefore, we have planned a CAROL SERVICE with no pastor.

Lee Tomboulian's holiday musical concert has been rescheduled for Sunday, Dec 11 at 2PM. We are hopeful a daytime performance will help attract those that are not comfortable driving at night. It will be an event featuring all forms of music (not just jazz) with 2 additional band members to accompany him.

A new approval form has been instituted by Session to help manage FUND RAISER EVENTS. Form will be available from the office. Any coordinator for future fund raisers must complete this form and forward it to the office several weeks prior to the event date. It will need Session's approval before the event can proceed.

Property committee has responded to extra safety measures suggested to aid in emergency situations. Six (6) motion detection cameras have been installed strategically throughout our building, with remote access to monitor activity, and history storage to view past events. Portable escape ladders will also be purchased to aid in evacuations from our second floor. Special thanks to P & W for keeping their snowplow fees unchanged throughout the past decade and to Scout Troop 44 for their annual leaf cleanup on our property. Quotes are being obtained for replacing our roof.

For those that missed our special worship service and recognition luncheon on Nov 13, it proved a wonderful day for fellowship. The sermon "Who is the church" can be viewed from a video posted on the home page of the church website. After watching, if you'd like to join POD PRIDE, you can call the office with your interest OR volunteer signup sheets are available on the piano in Fellowship Hall. Pastor Choi's recognition luncheon was an uplifting event including a looping pictorial presentation capturing Justin's 4 years of service, great food contributions, and heartfelt memories shared of his time with us. During his last Session meeting, Elders thanked him for his leadership with special recognition for getting us through the Pandemic shutdown months. We wish he and his family God's blessings.

Outdoor canopy for use during the Rummage Sale and other outdoor event


2 Christmas trees for the sanctuary (designated in Phyllis' memory)

RECIPE ROUND-UP

MARINATED MOZZARELLA BALLS

Looking for a delicious and simple yet stunning appetizer for the upcoming holidays, a family gathering or just because you'd like to try something new? This recipe using fresh bocconcini or mozzarella





Ingredients:

- 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 2 -3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 / 2 tablespoon fresh parsley, finely chopped
- 1 / 2 tablespoon fresh basil, finely chopped
- 1 teaspoon fresh oregano, finely chopped
- 1 / 4 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes (or more to taste)
- L / 8 teaspoon salt
- 8 ounce container mozzarella balls or bocconcini, DRAINED

Instructions:

In a medium jar or container that has a tight fitting lid combine olive oil, garlic, parsley, basil, oregano, red pepper flakes, and salt. Cover jar or container with lid and shake to combine.

Place the drained mozzarella balls in a medium bowl that has a lid. Add the olive oil mixture and stir to fully coat. Seal the bowl and refrigerate for at least 1 hour to allow flavors to infuse.

Serve in a serving bowl with a side of toasted pita bread or other crusty bread.

Notes: Marinated bocconcini is best served fresh. You can store it for up to one day, but longer than that the texture begins to change.

If you do have leftovers, the olive oil will solidify in the refrigerator. Just allow the bowl to sit at room temperature for 20 minutes or so until the oil thaws.


