RECIPE ROUNDUP

No Bake Pasta Bake Serves 5 - 6

Ingredients:

8 ounces (3 cups) dried pasta such as small shells, bowties, fusilli, or spirals

4 links chicken sausage, sweet or hot Italian sausage, or mini meatballs. If using sausage cook then cut into ½ inch thick rounds

1 (28 ounce) can diced tomatoes with the juice (cut up tomatoes into small pieces)

2 cups shredded mozzarella, divided

½ teaspoon garlic powder

½ teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon Italian seasoning

½ teaspoon black pepper

1 /2 cup diced onion softened (place onion in a small bowl with a pat of butter. Microwave for 2 minutes)

1 cup heavy cream (don't substitute)

1 cup chicken stock

½ cup shredded Parmesan cheese

Directions:


Preheat oven to 400 degrees. In a 7-8 cup greased casserole dish add the uncooked pasta, sausage, diced tomatoes **with juice**, 1 cup mozzarella cheese, garlic powder, salt, Italian seasoning, black pepper, and onion. Stir well. Pour the heavy cream and chicken stock over top and make sure that all of the pasta is submerged. Press down with the bake of a spatula or large spoon.

Cover with two layers of aluminum foil making sure to crimp it very well so it is sealed. Put dish in the over for approximately 1 hour and 15 minutes.

Remove from oven. Sprinkle with remaining mozzarella cheese and

Parmesan. Return to oven uncovered for 5 minutes or until cheeses have melted.

Remove from oven and let the pasta rest **uncovered** for 15 minutes before serving. This is important as the sauce really thickens up in this time. ENJOY!!!
