SESSION'S REFLECTIONS

Our hope is that everyone enjoyed a joyous Christmas holiday with our church and your family. Much went into the planning for the holiday traditions for our church. Our Christian Education committee, teachers, choir, and students worked hard to perform a wonderful Christmas pageant on December 18. Our Music Director Lee Tomboulian pulled together a musical Christmas Eve service with the help of 2 hired musicians. A Carol Sing service was planned for Christmas Day. All this was coordinated through our Worship Committee Chair, George Stoft and Deacons who provided the ushers and greeters. George will be working on pulpit supply to provide worship service coverage for the months of January and February.

Clerk of Session with the help of Senior Saints will be working in early January to gather all our historic records stored throughout our attics, closets, and file storage. Our goal is to safeguard these important documents by cataloging them, determining what will remain on our premises, and what will be transported for storage in PCUSA Historic Storage site in Philadelphia. We will purchase a fireproof safe to store records in-house once we determine the scope and size of the files we will keep at the church.

Mark your calendars for Sunday, January 29 for our annual congregational meeting immediately following church service. This meeting will include committee reports detailing activities of the past year, submission of the 2023 budget by the Finance Committee for approval by our membership, suggested changes to our Bylaws, approval of officers for the new year, and other important topics. It's an important meeting and we hope to have good attendance.

Session was happy to approve health benefits for our Church Secretary, Sandy Muzzillo. To facilitate coverage, we needed to increase her hours from 15 to 20 hours/week. Starting January, her office hours will be Monday and Wednesday, 9AM to 4PM and Thursday she will work from home 9AM to 1PM. The balance 2 hours will be filled as needed – checking phone messages, answering calls, and attending to church business as the need arises.

A special thanks was offered for Elders rotating off Session effective Jan 1. Rich Hepp served a whopping 9 consecutive years as Finance Chair and active member of the Property Committee. Don Wright served hard labor for 3 years as Property Chair and Congregational Life Chair. Matt Smart served 6 years as Outreach Chair, Christian Ed Committee, Personnel Committee, and a continuing active member of the PNC. We welcome Kit Rusinack as the only volunteer to fill a leadership roll beginning Jan 2023. She will be serving as Congregational Life/Outreach Chair. With 4 vacant Elder positions remaining unfilled in the new year, we will be dependent on volunteer labor to complete the work needed to keep our doors open and our ministry and outreach efforts vibrant. We are hopeful many will fill the need when called upon.

glorious....our children were fabulous and touched all our hearts with love and warm memories. Our older confirmands did a wonderful job with the narration.


