From the Pastor's desk...

Dear Church Family,

Our days are filled with things to do, email to write, phone calls to make, appointments to keep, and shoveling snow. We always have something to do. The season of Lent brings additional layers of activity, but I hope and pray the Lent practices are not to make another layer of what-to-do lists on your life. In truth, the opposite is what Lent is designed for. It is to help us not to be busy, but stay still.

Henry Nouwen says, "From all that I said about our worried, overfilled lives, we are usually surrounded by so much inner and outer noise that it is hard to truly hear our God when he is speaking to us. We have often become deaf, unable to know when God calls us, and unable to understand in which direction he calls us". We need to learn to listen to God. There is some free inner space where we can listen to our God and follow his guidance."

The season of Lent is set aside for us to reorient ourselves, to gain the proper perspective on things, and put our priorities in order. We take off our old self so we might be adequately prepared for Easter. Lent starts with the words, "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return," That is the heart of Lent. To get there we may need to slow the rhythm of our days enough that we can move from deafness to obedient listening. This kind of listening does not magically happen all at once. It is a practice that must be cultivated and cultivating anything takes time.

Jesus always listening to God the Father. He always has attentive ears to God and always has alert for God's directions. It was this being tuned into God that enabled Jesus to tell his followers: "Do not worry about your life, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." (Matthew 6)

The Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting, meditation, and donation have further meaning than the ritual themselves. They are tools that pay better attention to the mercy of God. Claimed by God in baptismal waters we are beloved children! The daily agenda for our lives has its starting point here.

With the anxiety of spreading the coronavirus, turbulent financial markets, and the uncertainties of the future, we have a chance to exercise of choosing which voice we will tune our ears to hear. As we gather at the Lord's Table and tune in to the words "this is my body...this is my blood...given for you," we are assured that Christ will walk with us in life or death, up and down, helping us to cling to the old rugged Cross and exchange it someday for a crown.

SESSION'S REFLECTIONS

We are excited that a new practice has been established to invite a Deacon Liaison to our monthly Session meetings. This will expand our communication abilities and help these 2 important leadership groups work in harmony with each other. A representative from Women's Association also joined our February meeting to update us on their exciting plans for the New Year. Session voted to reopen our Sanctuary for Sunday worship starting February 28, following the safety protocols established for reopening in the fall. Masks will be mandatory and ushers will be socially distancing all seating upon arrival. The State mandates our occupancy cannot exceed 35%, which permits seating for 73 people in our Sanctuary. Overflow capabilities into Fellowship Hall can accommodate an additional 73 people, with viewing of the service available through monitors. Beginning in the month of March, WMPC will leave Palisades Presbytery and become members of the NW Presbytery (formally known as Newton). We will look forward to getting to know our new Presbytery and working with their staff.

CALLING ALL TECH SAVVY MEMBERS: We need to support our Pastor in the new virtual reality we find ourselves living in these days. We are forming a committee that can help record our Sunday services, handle postings on Facebook and U-Tube, set up technology required for overflow services into Fellowship Hall, and lend a helping hand with other virtual projects in our future. 

RECIPE ROUNDUP

Blueberry Cobble Serves 6

2 cups fresh or frozen blueberries washed, drained, and picked over

1 fresh lemon, zest half of it and then squeeze 1 tablespoon of the juice

1 1/2 cups sugar, divided

6 tablespoons butter, cubed

1 cup all purpose flour

1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

1/8 teaspoon nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

3 / 4 cup milk

1 large egg, lightly beaten

whipped cream/or topping, optional

DIRECTIONS

Heat oven to 350 degrees.

In a saucepan, stir together berries, lemon juice and 1/2 cup sugar. Bring to a boil; remove from the heat. Set aside. Place butter in an 11/7 inch baking dish; (you could use an 8×8 pan or even a round cake pan) Put cubed butter in the baking dish and then in the preheated oven. When butter has melted remove dish.

In a small bowl, combine the remaining **1 cup sugar** with the flour, baking powder, salt, cinnamon and nutmeg. In a measuring cup measure the milk. Add the beaten egg and zest. Use a fork to combine then add to the flour mixture. Stir to combine.

Pour the milk and flour mixture carefully over the melted butter in baking dish. **DO NOT STIR.** Spoon reserved berry mixture over the batter. **DO NOT STIR.**

Place dish in the oven (may want to place a piece of aluminum foil under the dish) and bake at 350 degrees for 40 – 45 minutes or until golden brown. Don't over bake. Serve at room temperature with whipped cream or whipped topping.
