

Food Pantry

What's with the food cart during Coffee Hour? Have you wondered why there's sometimes a cart full of assorted grocery items parked near the Communication Table in Fellowship Hall? It isn't unusual for food pantry donations to include the odd item that doesn't fit into the form that food pantry clients fill out to tell us what they need. Some examples: bottled grape leaves, stevia packets, garlic jelly. Or it might be an item that's specific to personal taste – not everyone likes or uses refried beans, soba noodles, whole wheat pasta, or mango chutney. And what about those items we receive that are past their "use by" date? Though the federal government says that the "use by" or "best by" date for canned items indicates the manufacturer's best guess at best flavor, the products are still perfectly safe to eat, and many of us don't think twice about using an Item we find on our shelves that's a bit past the date. But as a food pantry, the Deacons decided that choice should be made by those who will be eating it, not us.

So here's what happens with those groceries that are unusual or past their date. On the food pantry day we make all those items available to our clients, set out on tables in Fellowship Hall. They are welcome to look over and choose what they'd like, and many of the products are taken. What isn't taken by clients we then put out at coffee hour, giving them a sort of second chance at going home with someone. We put out a donation basket, and whatever we receive is used to purchase more of the typical food requests, like coffee, juice or canned meat. The Deacons want you to know we are trying to be good stewards of the donated goods we receive, as well as caring for people in our community in need. If you'd like to talk some more about how the food pantry works, speak to any of our deacons.
