I have heard some of your concerns, saying "We don't want you to travel a lot, it takes to hike for you to come up here."

I would say, "Distance doesn't matter if our hearts loyal to Christ who is our Lord and Savior."
When Israel people celebrate their worship through Passover, the distance doesn't matter."
2 Chronicles 30:5 says during Hezekiah's Passover

"They decided to send a proclamation throughout Israel, from Beersheba to Dan, calling the people to come to Jerusalem and celebrate the Passover to the LORD, the God of Israel. It had not been celebrated in large numbers according to what was written."
