When I meet non-WMPC people, I gladly introduce myself as the pastor of the West Milford Presbyterian Church. In fact, it was a big surprise when Jun and Yujin came to our worship last Sunday. They are the lovely couple in which I officiated their wedding a few weeks ago. You don't have to be big to make a big splash for the Kingdom; you just have to be willing to help someone the way God helped you.

When I invited a neighbor to the church he said, "I don't need a church." I replied, "Maybe someone needs you!"

In the same way, I have no doubt that there is someone who desperately needs your help to learn what God has taught you.

So, where do you start stewardship? My first step in helping other people begin with recognizing that I needed help. I needed to learn. Pride stops us from being utilized greatly by God. When I confessed my need and became open to God, God opened a whole new world of growth and understanding to me. The barriers to helping other peoples are not "out there" but inside our hearts.

I love the story of a donor from Food Pantry, who told me that Hurricane Sandy wiped out this town, and our church stepped in and opened up our church doors to the neighborhood. They still remember your hospitalities and stewardship, which enabled them to pay attention to the needs of other people in our town. Our church made the call when it was needed the most, no excuses, no waiting for perfect conditions — we did what we could with what we had. We became a model of Christ's love. There is no limit to God's power and blessings on our church, especially with your stewardship! God loves you and God bless you!



PASTORAL SEARCH UPDATE

A special thank you to everyone who participated in the Congregational Vitality Survey distributed in October. This was the first step in a very lengthy process of searching for a permanent pastor. These surveys were mailed back to Presbytery for processing. They will scan all the forms and provide us a very detailed report about the results. It will be mid-November or early December before we receive these reports back. We are hopeful the results will help us more clearly understand who we are as a church now and what we would like to become in our future. With these results in hand, a committee will work hard to create a Mission Study that will help us define the leadership we will need from a new pastor. The completed Mission Study - which will take considerable time to prepare - must be sent on to Presbytery for their review and approval. It would be our hope that mid to late Spring we will actually be able to put a Pastoral Nominating Committee together to begin the Pastoral Search. We ask for your much needed patience and prayers during this important and lengthy process.
