problem. If we're patient as a member, we can see the changes

important changes.

Any issues our church has didn't develop overnight. You can't fix them overnight, either. Slow the pace of change and be patient; growth takes time.

It's not how you start; it's how you finish, our church won't have the ministry fruitfulness we want unless we're committed to put ourselves more into this season of changes and being patient in the process. Bless you.


Please consider pledging as much as possible. We know it's a rough time but the Church needs all the help it can get. We will be collecting the card's back on October 20th at the consecration breakfast.

CONGREGATIONAL VITALITY SURVEY

RETURN BY OCTOBER 6TH

The last week of September, members of our congregation were mailed a Worshiper Survey entitled U.S. CONGREGATIONAL VITALITY SURVEY (USCVS). This is the first step in gathering information directly from our congregation that will help us as we move forward with our Pastoral Search. Participation in this survey is anonymous and extremely important to ensure the needs of our congregation are heard and considered when determining who we are, where we want to head, and what leadership we will need in our future. We are hopeful every member of our church will complete this survey. If there is a husband and wife who hold membership, we would ask each individual complete their own survey. A return envelope was included in the mailing – to be mailed or delivered directly back to church by Sunday, October 6th. We will offer one opportunity to complete this survey immediately following the October 6th church service for those who have not already done so by this date. A box labeled CONGREGATIONAL SURVEY will be available in our church office AND in the vestibule of our sanctuary for return of the completed forms. Any questions can be directed to Elders Betsy Engelhardt or Matt Smart.

IMPORTANT: The survey must remain flat with no folds. They were mailed out to your homes with no folds and asked to be returned with no folds. The completed surveys will be sent to our Presbytery to be scanned, data organized, and reports filed back to us. Folds in the paperwork affect the accuracy of the scanning process. Survey should be completed using #2 pencil OR a black or blue ballpoint pen.
